### DAILY PLAN:

**Break Camp and load into personal vehicle or box truck.**  
**Participants can load dry clothes into box truck to use when being  
shuttled back to starting point.**

- 7:30 - 8:30 a.m.** Breakfast and Registration at Sand Island, Bethlehem
- 8:30 a.m.** Safety Briefing—All participants are required to attend the daily safety briefing and wear a USCG-approved Type III personal floatation device (PFD) at all times on the river.
- 9:00 a.m.** Launch from Sand Island, Bethlehem. Participants leave their personal vehicle in Bethlehem for the day. Wildlands Conservancy will shuttle drivers back to Bethlehem at the end of the day to pick up their vehicles.
- 11:00 a.m.** Lunch at Bethlehem Boat Club with education program by Langan Engineering and Environmental Services
- 2:00 p.m.** Education Program on Island Park
- 3:30 - 5:00 p.m.** Take-out location: Hugh Moore Park, Easton. End time depending on river conditions. Closing Ceremony held.
- After closing ceremonies, drivers only** board shuttle to pick up personal vehicles in Bethlehem.
